



Homicide vigil

About 30 people gathered in prayer at an ecumenical homicide vigil on Saturday, May 15, at the alley between East Siebenthaler and Ashwood avenues where Michael Nevins, 36, was shot to death Tuesday, May 11. Police have said the Nevins killing could be in retaliation for the July 2004 killing of Delaquon Brown. Nevins was convicted of that crime and served four years in prison. "We keep on hoping and we keep on praying that what we do makes a difference," said Sister Jeanette Buehler of the Sisters of the Precious Blood, which organized the vigil. The group will assemble again next Saturday for two more homicide vigils: one for Kimberly Paradiso, who was found in March strangled and beaten behind a Warder Street house; and one for John W. Robinson Jr., who was shot Thursday at the Washington Arms apartment complex and died the next day at Miami Valley Hospital. Staff photo by Chris Stewart
