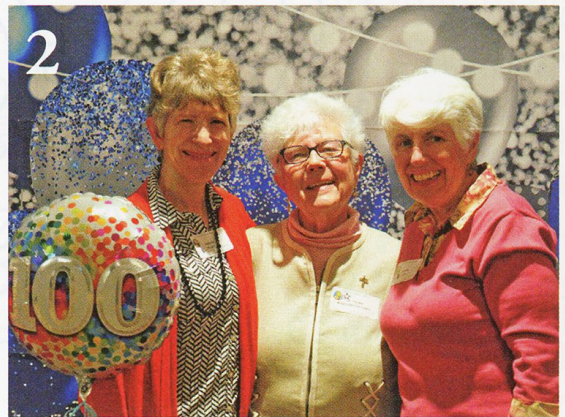


3) SUA's Hands Across Campus
