We come before You with heavy hearts, mindful of the lives that hang in the balance, and the complexity of human existence. We acknowledge that You alone are the Giver of life, and only You hold the right to take it away. We humbly beseech Your mercy and grace for those who find themselves on death row, for they too are Your children. You, in Your infinite wisdom, made us all imperfect, and in our imperfection, we sometimes commit grave injustices. Let them find good, holy people in their lives who can show them Your love, for it is through these individuals that they will learn about You.

May they participate in programming that contributes positively and helps them navigate the complex spiritual and emotional challenges of prison. Help them abide by the rules and accept their limitations.

We also pray for forgiveness and reconciliation, both from the perpetrators' and the victims' families. We understand that reconciliation may not always be achieved in person or reciprocated, but we trust in Your all-powerful nature to bring healing and closure.
